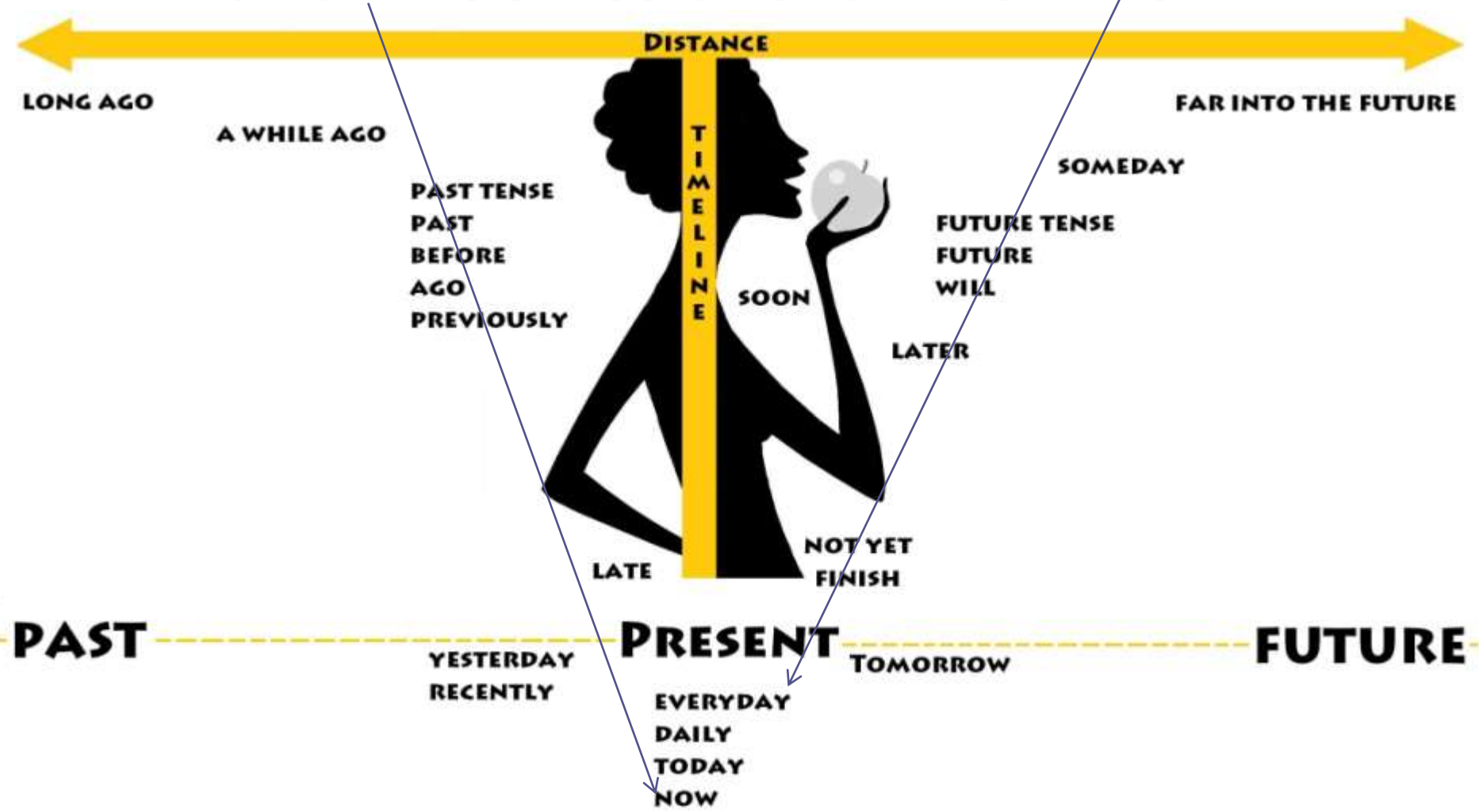

Present progressive...

We use the PRESENT PROGRESSIVE for:

- Actions that are happening at the moment of speaking.
- Future arrangements.

× Example:

I ^{H.V.} **am** watch^{ing} TV at this moment.

She ^{H.V.} **is** play^{ing} tennis now.

We ^{H.V.} **are** do^{ing} a lot of different things in this moment.

The Earth ^{H.V.} **is** go^{ing} around the Sun right now.

They ^{H.V.} **are** work^{ing} very hard now.

Now... **You** ^{H.V.} **are** play^{ing} video-games.

VERB (ing)

VERB (ing)

Present progressive... Time expressions.

We use these time expressions in Present Progressive / Present Continuous.

Now.

At the moment.

In this moment.

Right now.

Example:

Please be quiet. **I am working**. [(=) I am working now]

Look! **Sue is wearing** her new hat. [(=) She is wearing it now]

Don't go out now. **It is raining**.

Where are the children? "**They are playing** in the park"

("on the phone") **We're having** dinner now. Can you call back later?

You can turn off the TV. **I'm not watching** it.

Correct form PRESENT PROGRESSIVE...



(+)

AFFIRMATIVE

- **(I)** am + verb (ing)
- **(You, We, They)** are + verb (ing)
- **(He, She, It)** is + verb (ing)



(-) NEGATIVE (NOT)

- **(I)** am not + verb (ing)
- **(You, We, They)** are not (*aren't*) + verb (ing)
- **(He, She, It)** is not (*isn't*) + verb (ing)

(+) AFFIRMATIVE

- **I am swimming** (*yo estoy nadando*)
- **You are swimming** (*tu estas nadando*)
- **We are swimming** (*nosotros estamos nadando*)
- **They are swimming** (*ellos estan nadando*)
- **He is swimming** (*el esta nadando*)
- **She is swimming** (*ella esta nadando*)
- **It is swimming** (*eso/aquello esta nadando*)



(-) NEGATIVE (not)

- H.V. Negative: *am not* | *aren't* | *isn't*

- **I am not swimming**
- **You aren't swimming**
- **We aren't swimming**
- **They aren't swimming**
- **He isn't swimming**
- **She isn't swimming**
- **It isn't swimming**

a) *am/are/is* = Helping Verb (+)

b) *are* + not = *aren't*

c) *is* + not = *isn't*

Am and *Are* = Helping Verb to ask

 (Q:) QUESTION ?

- *Is* he swimming ?
- *Is* she swimming ?
- *Is* it swimming ?



(s.a.) Short Answer:

- (+) Yes, he *is*.
- (-) No, he *isn't*.
- Yes, she *is*.
- No, she *isn't*.
- Yes, it *is*.
- No, it *isn't*.

Is = Helping Verb to ask (3rd person)

LOOK THE CORRECT FORM...

REMEMBER...

- Use **H.V.** Helping Verb for present progressive **am, are** and **is** to affirmative form.

Negative Helping Verb **am not, aren't** and **isn't** in negative form.

- To ask questions use H.V. **Am (I)** , **Are (you, we, they)** and **Is (he, she, it)**... ?

Not forget use VERB with (**ing**) and don't use stative verbs in present progressive.

Example:

Correct... I'm hungry **right now**. I **want** an apple.

Incorrect... I **am wanting** an apple.

Example:

Correct... I **hear** a siren. **Do you hear** it too?

Incorrect... I'm **hearing** a siren. Are you **hearing** it too?

We use present simple for...



Habits or actions that happen regularly.

Example:

I watch TV everyday.

You drink milk in the mornings.

We go to the school on monday.

They play tennis on weekends.

He drinks water all days.

She eats fruit after lunch.

It (school ring bell) sounds at 7:30 AM

Present Simple Time Expressions:

- **ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY...**

- **EVERY...**
day/week/month/year, etc.
- **MOMENTS...** In the ...

- **On Mondays, on the
weekend, etc.**

Present simple...

We use the PRESENT SIMPLE for habits or actions that happen regularly.

× *Example:*

*I **drink** ice tea in the summer.*

*She **plays** soccer on the weekend.*

*We **do** a lot of different things in our free time.*

*The Earth **goes** around the Sun.*

*They **work** very hard.*

*You **play** video-games everyday.*

- Begin >>> begins.

- Tell >>> Tells.

NOTE: verb *have* not apply "*haves*" it uses *has*

Correct form of the PRESENT SIMPLE...

- Base form of the Verb (**I, you, we, they**)
- Modify verb (**he, she, it**)



AFFIRMATIVE



NEGATIVE

- **Don't** = Do not (**NOT**)
- **Doesn't** = Does not

- **Does she** eat fruit?

Yes, she does. No, she doesn't.

- **They** don't play soccer, they play basketball.
- **Mary** works in the school.
- **Do I** clean my room?

Yes, I do. No, I don't.

- **He** doesn't buy candies, he buys fruit.
- **Do you** like English class? (*your answer*)

REMEMBER...

Modify verb (-s, -es, -ies) only in 3rd person affirmative form (+) and **Base form of the verb** for (I, you, we, they)

Use **don't** + verb (base form) and **doesn't** + verb (base form) in negative form (-)

To ask questions with...

Do (I, you, we, they) verb (base form)? and

Does (he, she, it) verb (base form)?

NEVER...

“P.P. + **doesn't** + **modify verb** (s, es, ies)”

“**Does** + P.P. + **modify verb** (s, es, ies)?”

Adverbs of frequency.

We use the adverbs of frequency to talk about how often we do something.

BEFORE the main verb:

[P.P. + “**Ad. Of Frequency**” + VERB (Base/Modify)]

John “**often**” plays soccer on Saturdays.

Peter doesn't “**always**” have breakfast.

AFTER verb **TO BE**:

[P.P. + **VERB (am, is, are)** + “**Ad. Of Frequency**”]

Sherly is “**never**” late for school.

My parents aren't “**sometimes**” on vacations.

Always(100%)

Frequently(90%)

Usually(80%)

Often(70%)

Sometimes(50%)

Seldom/rarely(20%)

Never(0%).

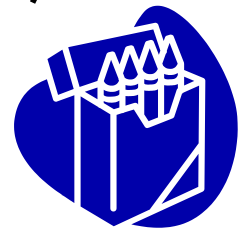
