

Demonstrative Adjectives: [This/That (singular) – These/Those (plural)]. Preposition of Place and Movement. There is (singular) – There are (plural).




<u>THIS - THAT & THESE - THOSE.</u> Demonstrative Adjectives.

" Look at THAT boat…"



PREPOSITIONS...

IN ENGLISH WE CAN FOUND DIFFERENT FORMS OF THE PREPOSITIONS...


- a) THEY HELP US TO KNOW WHERE people & things ARE LOCATED.
- b) THEY HELP US TO GET DIRECTIONS.

c) THEY SHOWN US TIME REFERENCES.



- **PLACE/POSITION**
- A. [in (inside), on/over/above, under/below,

next to, between, in front of, behind,



B. <u>PLACE/MOVEMENT</u> (between, along, beside, across from, into, out of, around, up, over, through, by or past...etc).

C. <u>TIME</u> (at, in, on).



PREPOSITION OF PLACE/POSITION.

We use the preposition of place to show where someone or something is.

PLACE/POSITION

[in (inside)]

Jack is in the box. The books are in the bag. Peter is in the box.


[on/over/above]

The clock is on the wall. The sofá is on the floor. The keys is on the table.


[under/below]

The cat is *under* the bed. The ball is *under* the table.














PREPOSITION OF PLACE/POSITION.

We use the preposition of place to show where someone or something is.

PLACE/POSITION

[next to (beside)]

The dog is next to the cat. My parents are next to the car. Karen is next to Peter.



NEXT TO


[behind]

The window is *behind* the couch. The football field is *behind* the school. The swimming pool is *behind* the house.


[in front of]

The TV is *in front of* the bed. The teacher is *in front of* me.









PREPOSITION OF PLACE/POSITION.

We use the preposition of place to show where someone or something is.

PLACE/POSITION

[ON (streets, avenues, roads, circuits, etc.)]

My house is on 3rd street (St.). Walt-mart is on Fuentes Mares Avenue (Ave.). Michael's restaurant is on East Road (Rd.).

[AT (specific places, parks, buildings, etc.)]

Turn left at the police station. Turn right at the park. My house is at the blue building.





PREPOSITION OF PLACE/MOVEMENT.

between / along / beside / across from.PLACE/MOVEMENTPLACE/MOVEMENT

[between (2 references)]

Chihuahua is between Coahuila and Sonora. My house is between the blue house and the red house. Jennifer is between Sofia and Daniela.

[along] There are many stores along the street. My classroom is along the building. The principal's office is along the hall.



[beside]

My bedroom is **beside** the badroom. The park is **beside** the church.



[across from]

The bank is across from the cinema. My car is across from the street.

EXAMPLES...

IN... The book is **in** the bag.

ON... The books are <u>on</u> the desk.

UNDER/BELOW... The cat is <u>under</u> the table.

NEXT TO/BESIDE... The pencil is <u>next to</u> the book.

BETWEEN... The pencil is <u>between</u> the **book** <u>and</u> the **bag**.

IN FRONT OF... The table is <u>in front of</u> the couch.

BEHIND... The cat is **<u>behind</u>** the couch.










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Where are they...???

D is **in front of B**.


E is **behind B**.

• THERE ISN'T (IS NOT)...

Examples:

There is a book on my desk.

There is a dog in her house.

There is a spider in the room.

There is a balcony in my house.

There is not a book on my desk.

There isn't a dog in her house.

There is not a spider in the room.

There isn't a balcony in my house.

There are two balconies in my house.

• THERE AREN'T (ARE NOT)...


Examples:
